### Updates in the Gulf - NOAA Reopens Northern Gulf to Fishing

Dear NOAA Fisheries Constituents and Stakeholders,

Today NOAA reopened commercial and recreational fishing in 5,130 square miles of Gulf waters, stretching from the far eastern coast of Louisiana, through Mississippi, Alabama, and the western Florida panhandle. The reopening also included the area currently open to finfish only, which will now be open for both finfish and shrimp. The reopening was announced under a re-opening protocol agreed to by NOAA, the FDA, and the Gulf States. A map, press release and all associated materials are posted to NOAA Fisheries Southeast Region website. This modification to the closure area will go into effect at 6PM Eastern time this evening.

To keep apprised of changes to the closed area, NOAA has a number of communication tools available to keep you informed. Please share this information with those who are interested but may be not be aware of these options.
