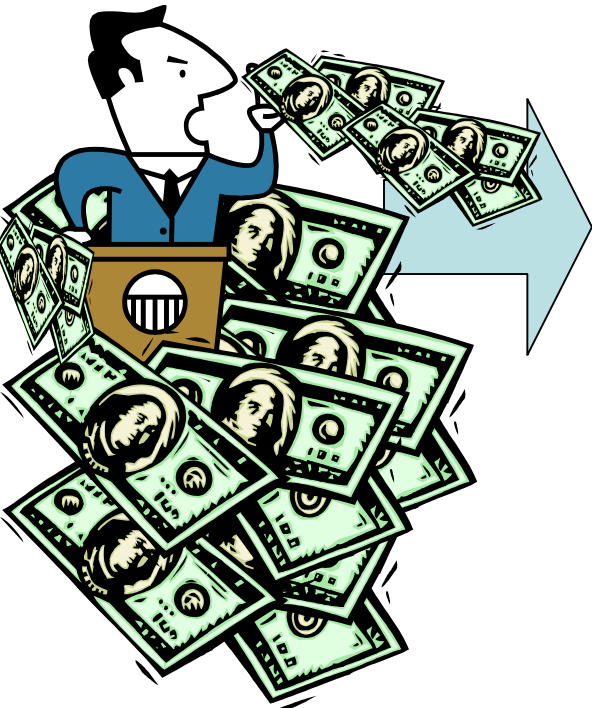
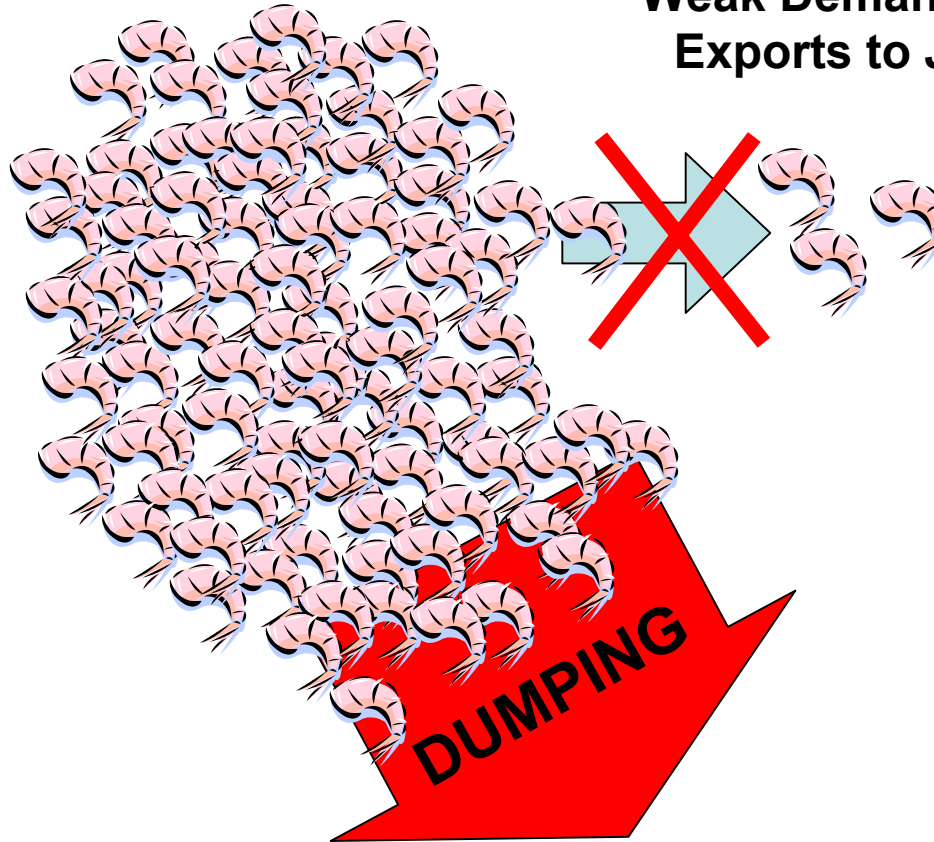

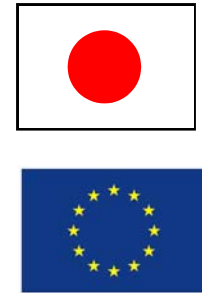
Subsidies and Gov't Intervention



Overproduction



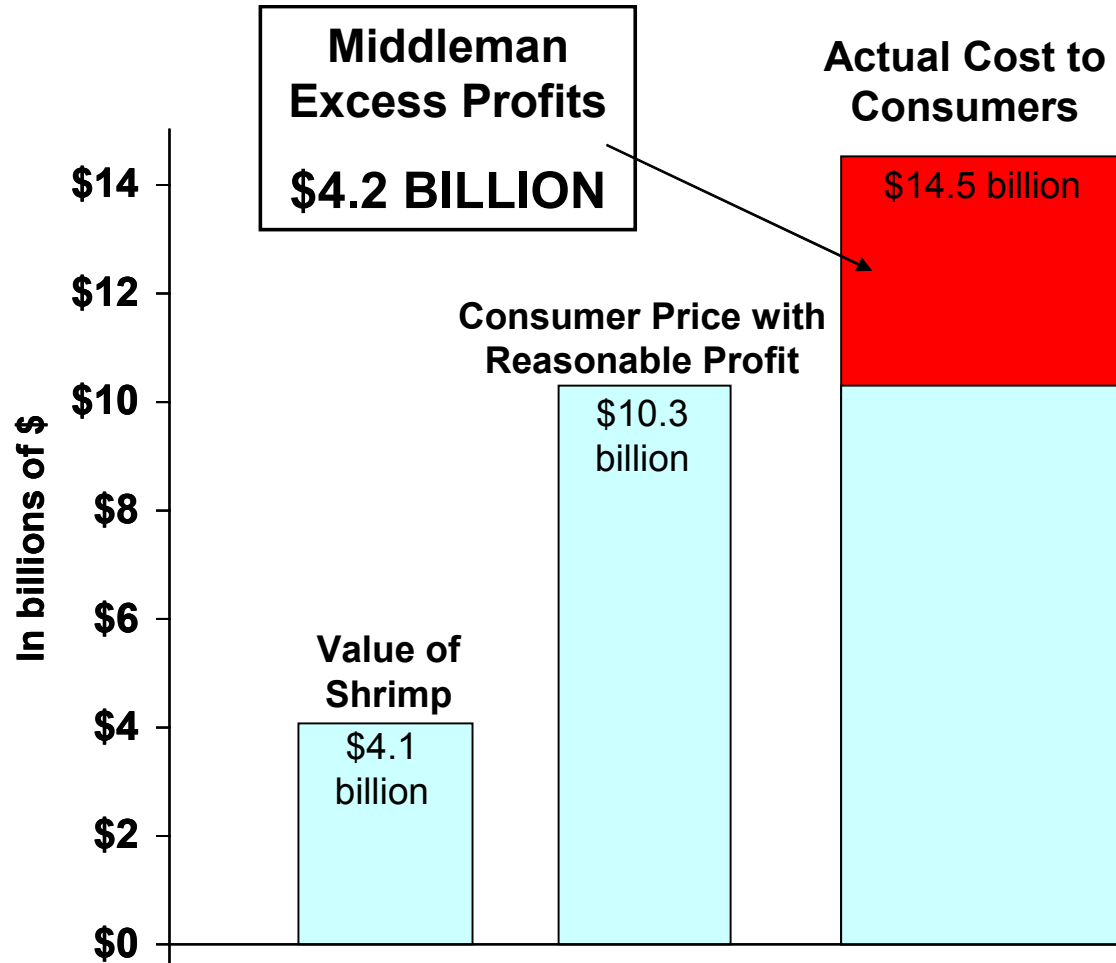
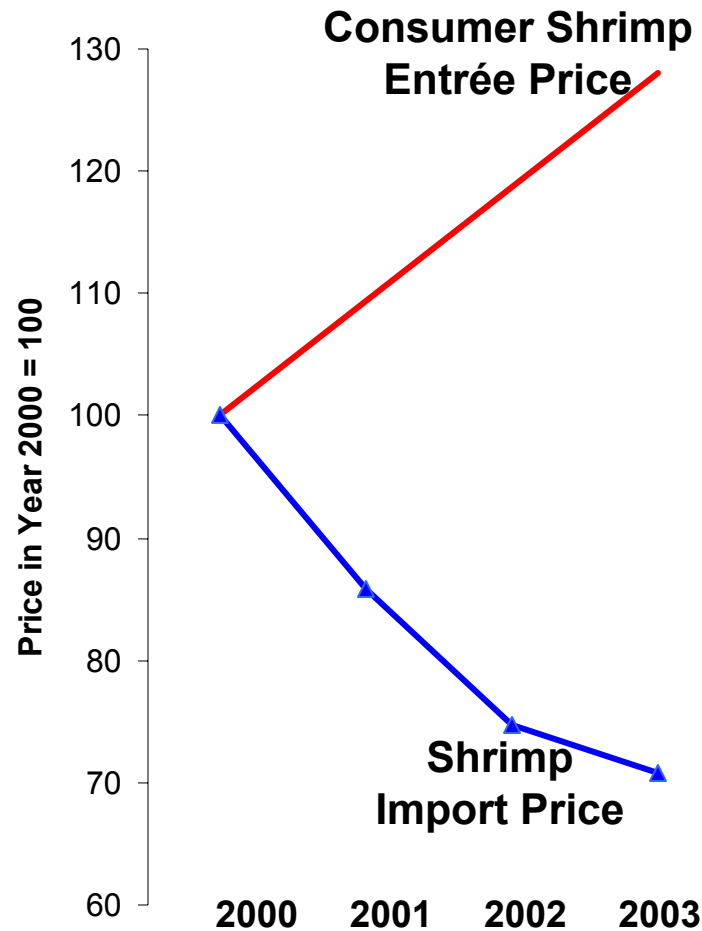
Year 2000: Tariffs, Testing & Weak Demand Limit Shrimp Exports to Japan and EU



U.S. Market Absorbs 71%
Increase 2000-2003

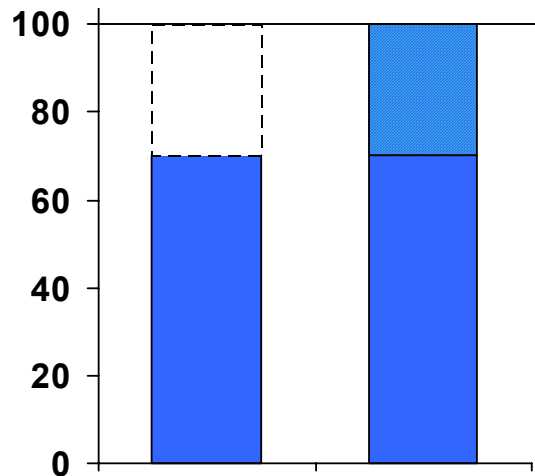
Import Price Drops 32%

Result: Dumped Imports Devastate Fishing Communities, Hurt Consumers, but Create BIG Profits for Middlemen



Solution: Antidumping Case Is Part of the Industry's Four Part Plan:

1. Dumping Case Restores Fair Prices



2. Country-of-Origin Labels Inform Consumers

3. Increased FDA Enforcement Stops Unsafe Shrimp



4. Marketing Plan Creates Premium for Wild-Caught Shrimp
